

## SPMC CIPROFLOXACIN TABLETS USP 250 mg CIPROFLOXACIN TABLETS USP 500 mg

### **PRESENTATION:**

#### CIPROFLOXACIN TABLETS USP 250 mg

Packs of 500, 1000 tablets

Each Circular11.5mm diameter, white colored, double convex film coated tablets with, SPMC or SPC letters in one side Each film-coated tablet contains 250 mg ciprofloxacin (as hydrochloride).

#### CIPROFLOXACIN TABLETS USP 500 mg

Packs of 500, 1000 tablets

Each Circular12.5mm diameter, white colored, double convex film coated tablets with, SPMC or SPC letters in one side Each film-coated tablet contains 500 mg ciprofloxacin (as hydrochloride).

### **INDICATIONS AND DOSE:**

Fistulating Crohn's disease <u>Adult</u>: 500 mg twice daily Respiratory-tract infections <u>Adult</u>: 500–750 mg twice daily <u>Adult</u>: 750 mg twice daily Urinary-tract infections <u>Adult</u>: 250–750 mg twice daily Acute uncomplicated cystitis in women <u>Adult</u>: 250 mg twice daily for 3 days Acute or chronic prostatitis <u>Adult</u>: 500 mg twice daily for 28 days Gonorrhoea <u>Adult</u>: 500 mg for 1 dose Most other infections Adult: Initially 500 mg twice daily; increased to 750 mg twice daily, in severe or deep-seated infection Surgical prophylaxis Adult: 750 mg, to be taken 60 minutes before procedure Anthrax (treatment and post-exposure prophylaxis) Adult: 500 mg twice daily Prevention of secondary case of meningococcal meningitis Child 1 month-4 years: 30 mg/kg (max. per dose 125 mg) for 1 dose Child 5–11 years: 250 mg for 1 dose Child 12–17 years: 500 mg for 1 dose Adult: 500 mg for 1 dose

# **CONTRA-INDICATIONS:**

Contra-Indicated in Patients with hypersensitivity to quinolone, and history of tendon disorders related to Quinolone use.

### Tendon damage

Tendon damage (including rupture) has been reported rarely in patients receiving quinolones. Tendon rupture may occur within 48 hours of starting treatment. Concomitant administration of ciprofloxacin and tizanidine

### SIDE EFFECTS:

Common or very common Flatulence Rare Abnormal dreams. Chest pain. Dysphagia Dyspnea erythema nodosum. flushes. Hot hyperglycaemia. hypoglycaemia. Oedema. Pancreatitis. Sweating. Syncope tachycardia Very rare intracranial hypertension. Movement disorders. Tenosvnovitis. Vasculitis (in Tinnitus. children) not known Frequency Peripheral neuropathy. Polyneuropathy

# CAUTIONS:

Acute myocardial infarction (risk factor for QT

Interval prolongation). Avoid excessive alkalinity of urine (risk of crystalluria). Bradycardia (risk factor for QT interval prolongation). Congenital long QT syndrome (risk factor for QT interval prolongation). Electrolyte disturbances (risk factor for QT interval prolongation). Ensure adequate fluid intake (risk of crystalluria). Heart failure with reduced left ventricular ejection fraction (risk Factor for QT interval prolongation).

History of

Symptomatic arrhythmias (risk factor for QT interval prolongation)

### **RENAL IMPAIRMENT:**

With oral use in adults Give 250–500mg every 12 hours if eGFR 30–60 mL/minute/1.73m2 (every 24 hours if eGFR less than 30 mL/minute/1.73m2).

### **PREGNANCY:**

A single dose of ciprofloxacin may be used for

The prevention of a secondary case of meningococcal meningitis.

### **BREAST FEEDING:**

Amount too small to be harmful but advises avoid.

### PATIENT AND CARER ADVICE:

Driving and skilled tasks May impair performance of skilled tasks (e.g. driving); Effects enhanced by alcohol.

# **INTERACTIONS:**

Some drugs may affect the way ciprofloxacin works, and ciprofloxacin

may affect other drugs you are taking. It's very important to let your doctor know about all drugs vou take, including overthe-counter (OTC) antacids, vitamins, and supplements. Many antacids, vitamins, and supplements that contain magnesium, calcium, aluminum, iron, or zinc can interfere with ciprofloxacin. Other OTC drugs, including such pain and fever medications as Advil. Aleve, and Motrin. may also interact with ciprofloxacin.Ciprofloxacin may increase the effects of caffeine. If you drink caffeinated drinks or take OTC medications that contain caffeine while taking ciprofloxacin, you may have some caffeine side effects such as nervousness, sleeplessness, or anxiety. You may not be able to take ciprofloxacin if you are also taking the drug theophylline to treat asthma and wheezing (brand names include Elixophyllin, Uniphyl, and Theo-24). Serious reactions, including heart attack, decreased ability to breathe, and seizures, have happened when people took medications together.Other these medications that with interact ciprofloxacin include:

## **STORAGE:**

Keep tightly closed in a cool dry place. Protect from light. Keep all medicines away from children. Store below  $30^{\circ}$  C.
